
Conference Room Seating

Q1. How many conference chairs per table?

A: Allow 24"–28" per person along each side of the table for comfortable seating. A 96" table seats 8 people (4 per side plus ends). Buy 2–3 extra chairs and store them — matching discontinued product is difficult.

Q2. Should I buy arms or armless for a conference room?

A: Arms for executive and standard conference rooms where comfort matters for 60–90 minute meetings. Armless for training rooms, flexible spaces, or dense seating configurations where maximizing seat count matters more.

Q3. Hard or soft casters for my floor type?

A: Hard (plastic) casters for carpet. Soft (rubber or polyurethane) casters for hard floors like wood, LVP, or polished concrete. Wrong casters scratch hard floors and roll unpredictably on carpet.

Q4. What's the most popular conference chair style right now?

A: Mid-back chairs in black fabric or black PU leather on casters are the most versatile and popular choice across commercial settings. Contemporary offices also favor mesh-back mid-back chairs for longer-session rooms.

Q5. Can I use task chairs in a conference room?

A: Yes — especially for smaller conference rooms or rooms that double as collaborative work areas. Task chairs with proper seat height work at conference tables. The trade-off is that task chairs have a less formal, more 'workstation' look than dedicated conference chairs.
