
Straight Desks

Q1. What straight desk size is right for my space?

A: Measure the wall, subtract 6" on each side for clearance, and match to the standard sizes: 48", 60", or 72". The 60" desk is the most versatile choice for a typical private office. Always confirm you have 36"+ of clear space behind the chair.

Q2. Laminate or solid wood — which is better for an office desk?

A: For commercial daily use, laminate (specifically HPL) is usually the better choice. It's more resistant to scratches, moisture, and daily contact than wood veneer. Solid wood looks better but requires more care and costs significantly more.

Q3. Do straight desks come with cable management?

A: Commercial-grade straight desks typically include a cable trough along the back edge and grommets for routing cords. Budget desks often omit these. If yours doesn't include cable management, aftermarket clips and under-desk trays are inexpensive solutions.

Q4. Can I pair a straight desk with a hutch?

A: Yes — many straight desk lines offer matching hutches that mount above the desk surface to add shelving and storage. Confirm the hutch is designed for the same desk line, and check ceiling clearance. Hutch + desk height typically lands around 60"–72" total.

Q5. What should I ask before ordering a straight desk online?

A: Confirm: surface material (HPL vs. TFL), frame material (steel vs. wood-based), weight capacity, warranty length, in-stock status, and lead time. Also verify the exact dimensions fit your space before ordering.
